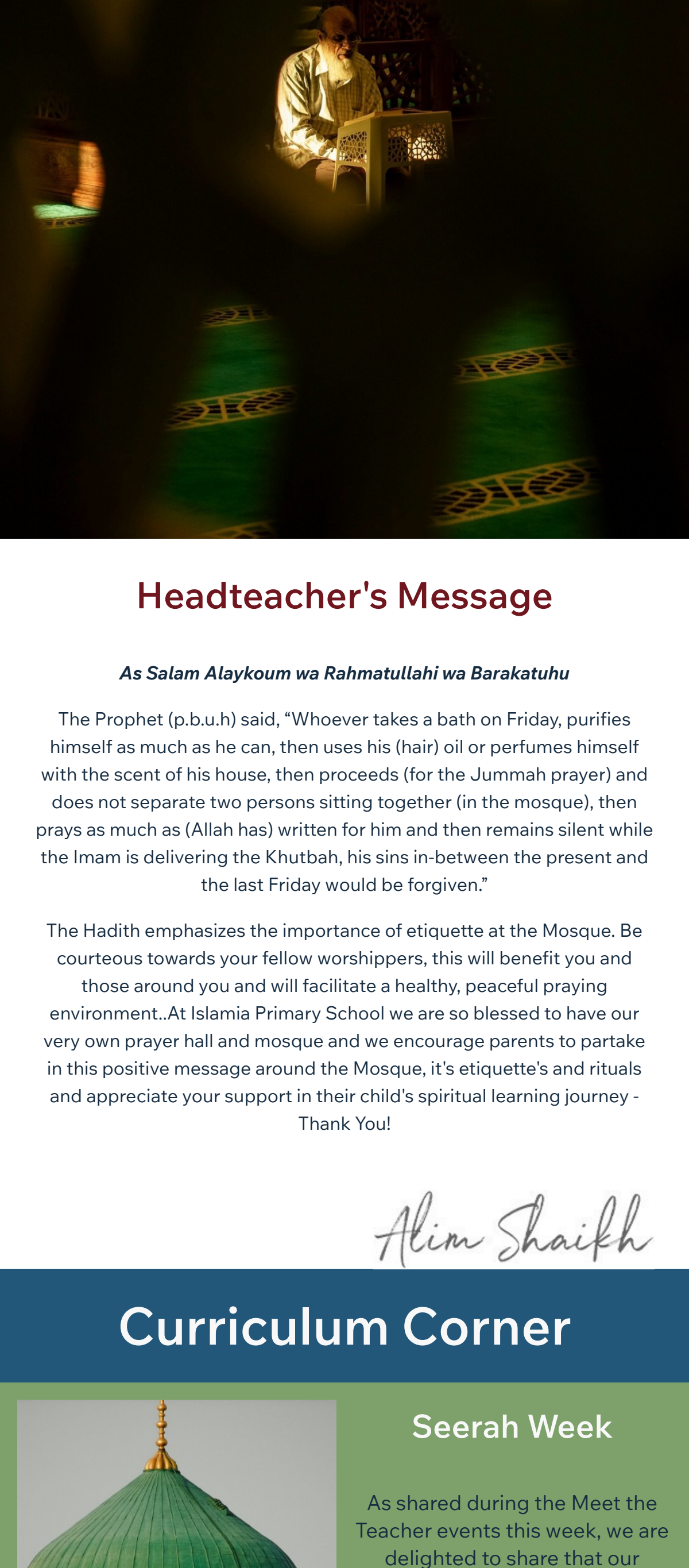

The Prophet (p.b.u.h) said, "Whoever takes a bath on Friday, purifies himself as much as he can, then uses his (hair) oil or perfumes himself and does not separate two persons sitting together (in the mosque), then prays as much as (Allah has) written for him and then remains silent while the Imam is delivering the Khutbah, his sins in-between the present and the last Friday would be forgiven."

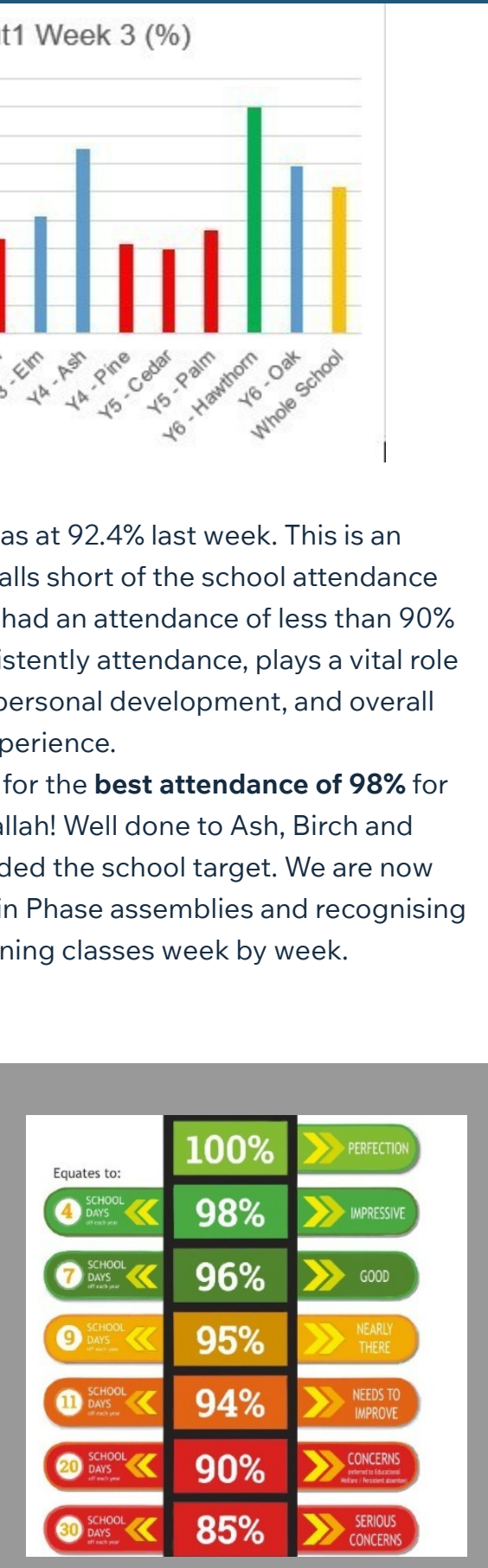


Seerah Week

School Council

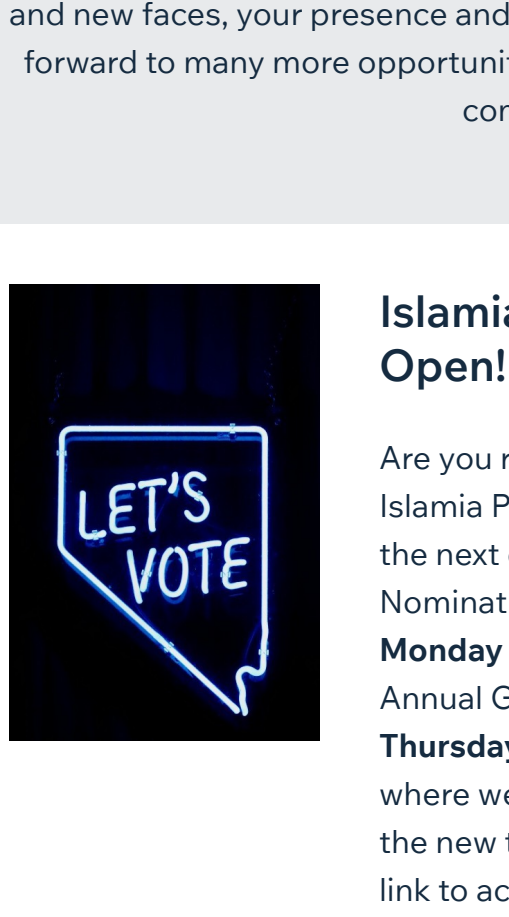
This week marked an exciting and important event in our school calendar - the **School Council elections**.

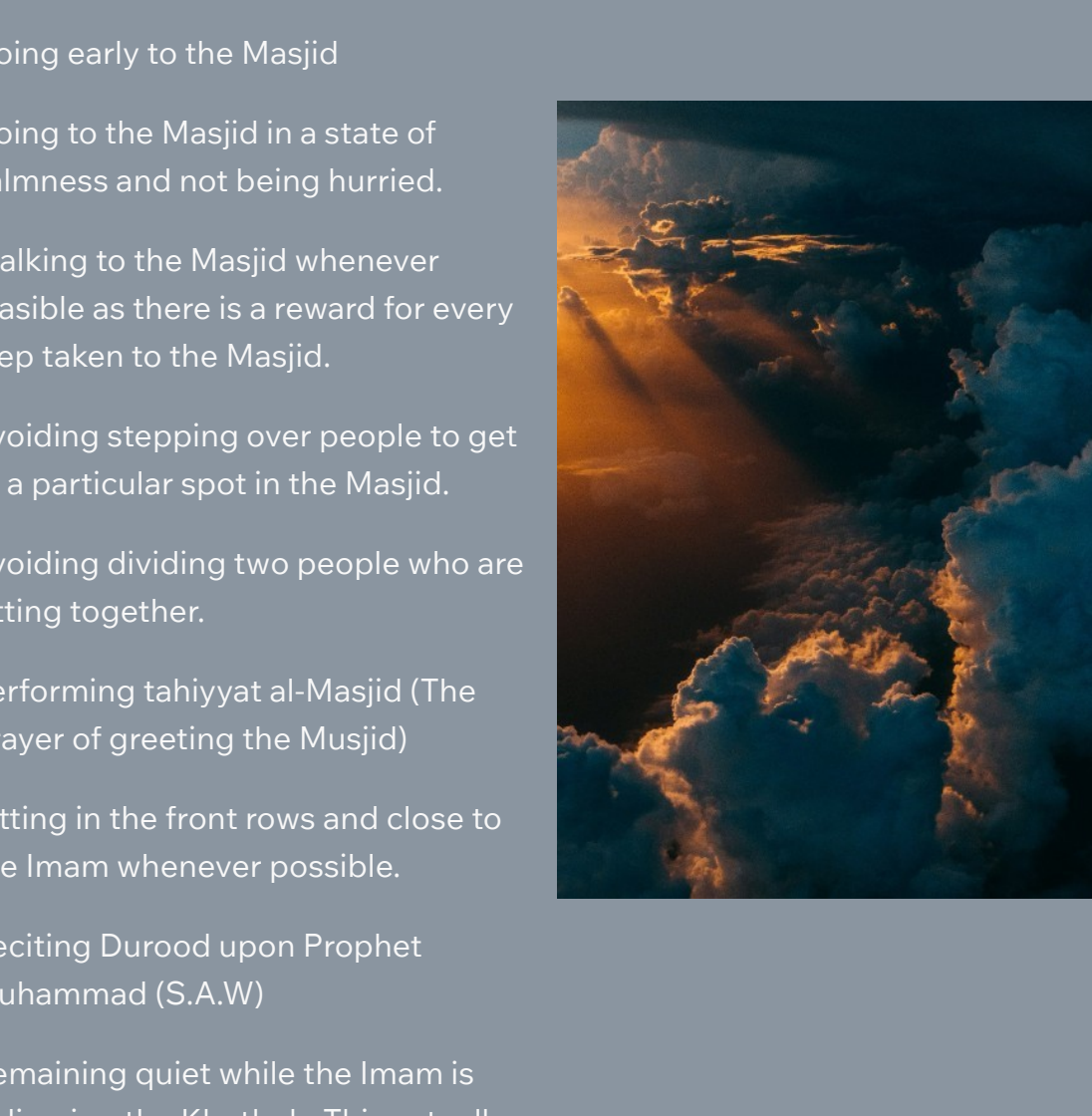


Year 5 Explore 'The Year of the Elephant'

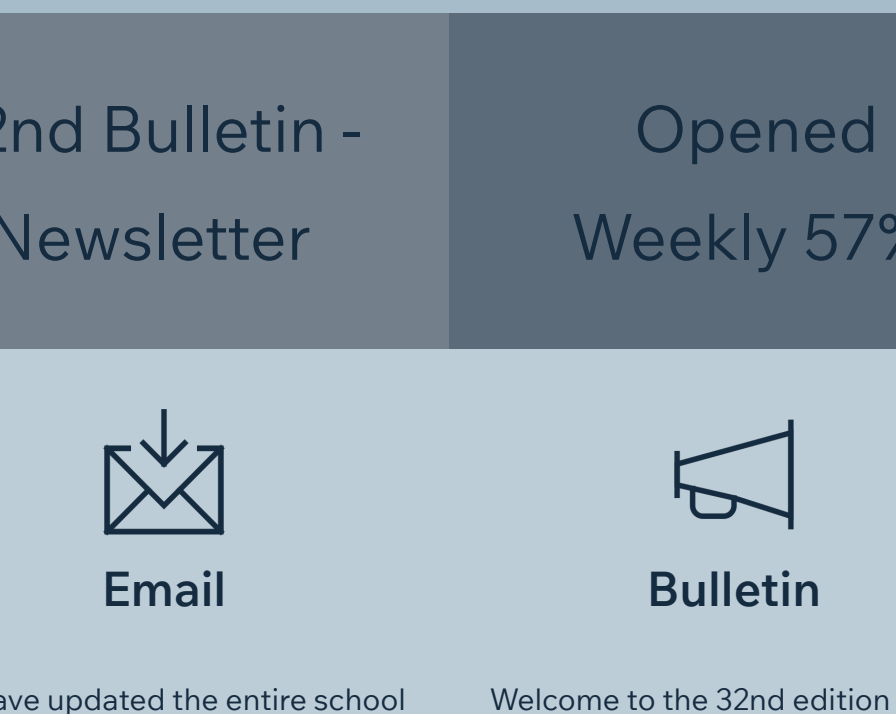

Attendance Matters!



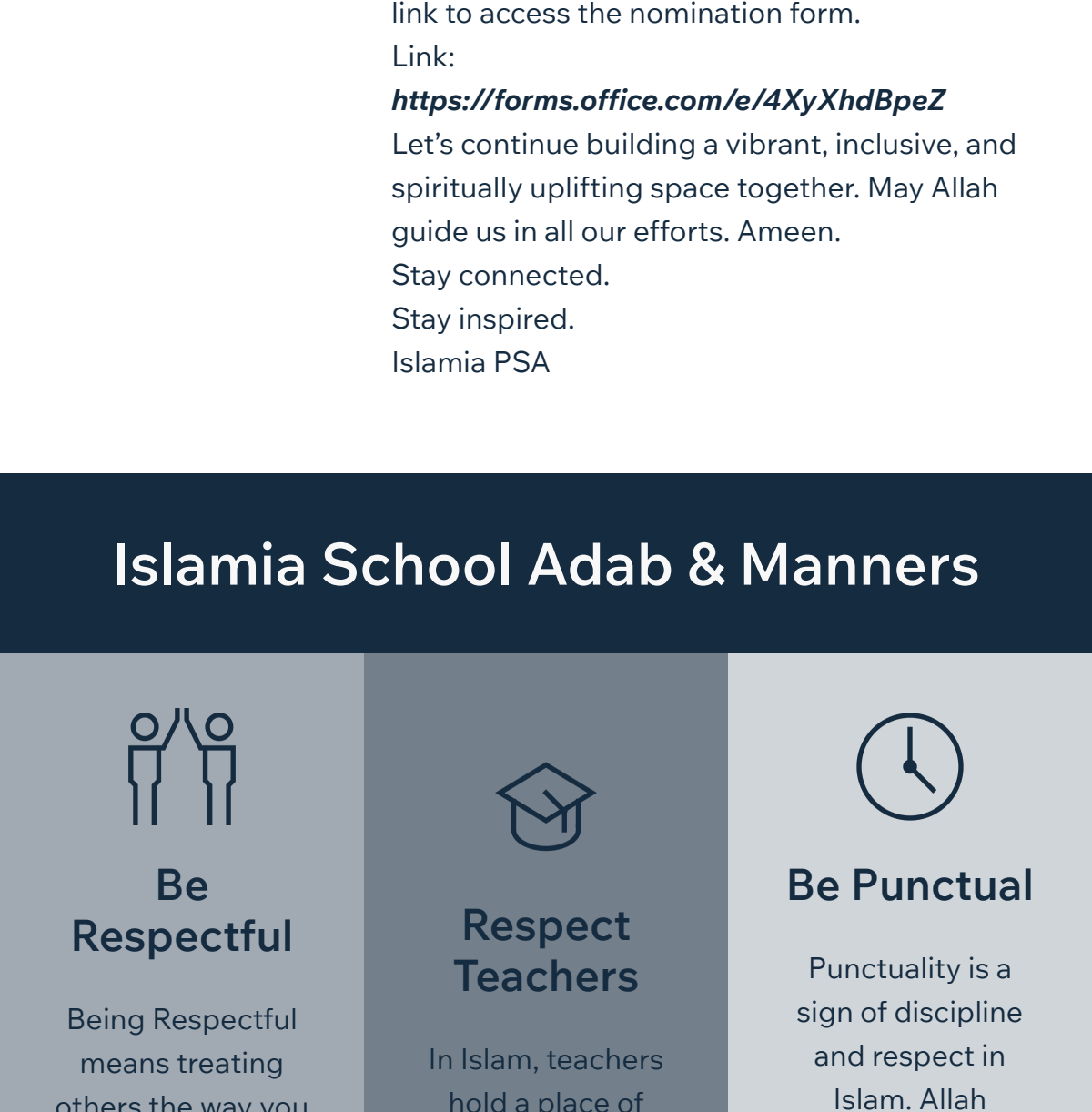

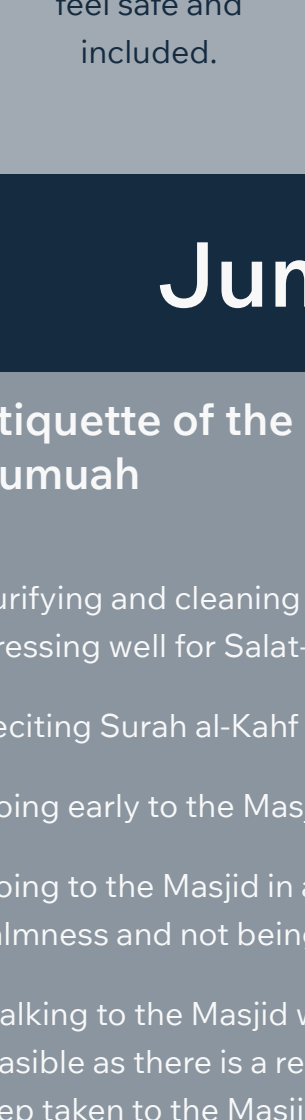

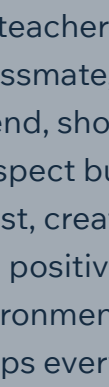
Islamia PSA Nominations Now Open!

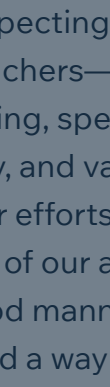

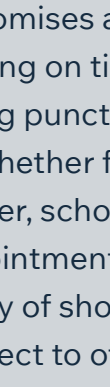
Be Respectful

Being Respectful means treating others the way you want to be treated. It's about using kind words, listening when someone is speaking, and valuing different opinions. Whether you're talking to a teacher, a classmate, or a friend, showing respect builds trust, creates a positive environment, and helps everyone feel safe and included.



Respect Teachers

In Islam, teachers hold a place of honor and respect, as they guide us toward knowledge and good character. The Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ) said, "I have been sent as a teacher." Respecting our teachers—by listening, speaking kindly, and valuing their efforts—is part of our adab (good manners) and a way of earning Allah's pleasure.



Be Punctual

Punctuality is a sign of discipline and respect in Islam. Allah reminds us in the Qur'an about the importance of fulfilling our trusts and commitments. The Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ) was known for honoring his promises and being on time. Being punctual—whether for prayer, school, or appointments—is a way of showing respect to others and being trustworthy in the eyes of Allah.

Jumuah Reminder

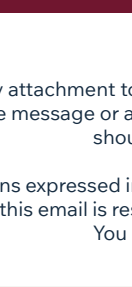
Etiquette of the day of Jumuah

- Purifying and cleaning oneself
- Dressing well for Salat-al-Jumuah
- Reciting Surah al-Kahf
- Going early to the Masjid
- Going to the Masjid in a state of calmness and not being hurried.
- Walking to the Masjid whenever feasible as there is a reward for every step taken to the Masjid.
- Avoiding stepping over people to get to a particular spot in the Masjid.
- Avoiding dividing two people who are sitting together.
- Performing tahiyyat al-Masjid (The prayer of greeting the Masjid)
- Sitting in the front rows and close to the Imam whenever possible.
- Reciting Durood upon Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W)
- Remaining quiet while the Imam is delivering the Khutbah. This actually includes listening to the Imam and not playing with anything while the Imam is speaking.

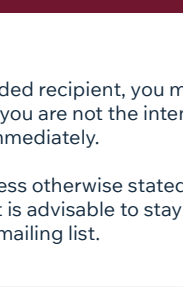

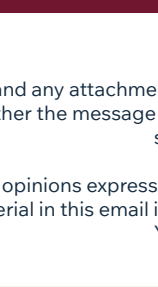
