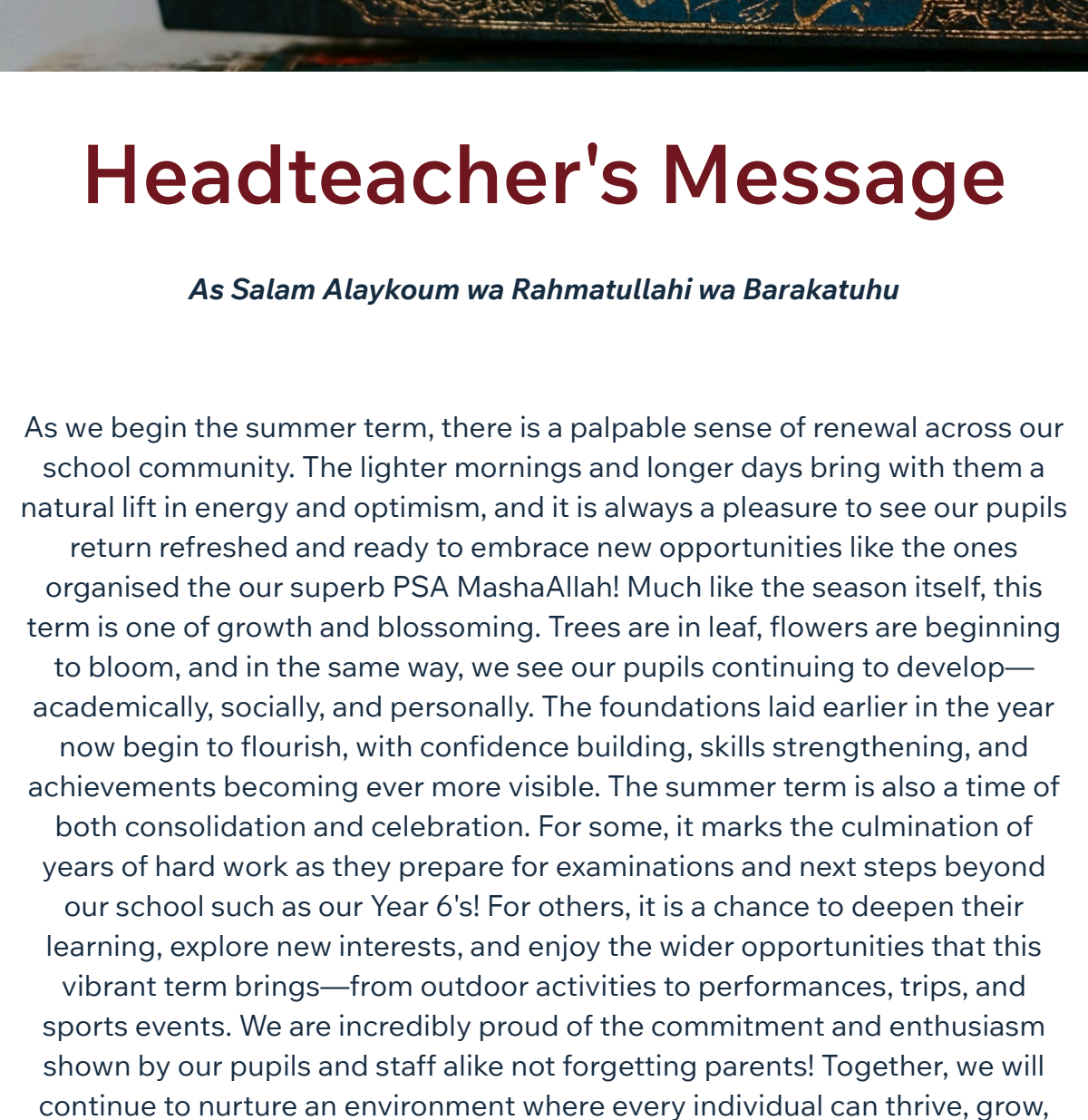

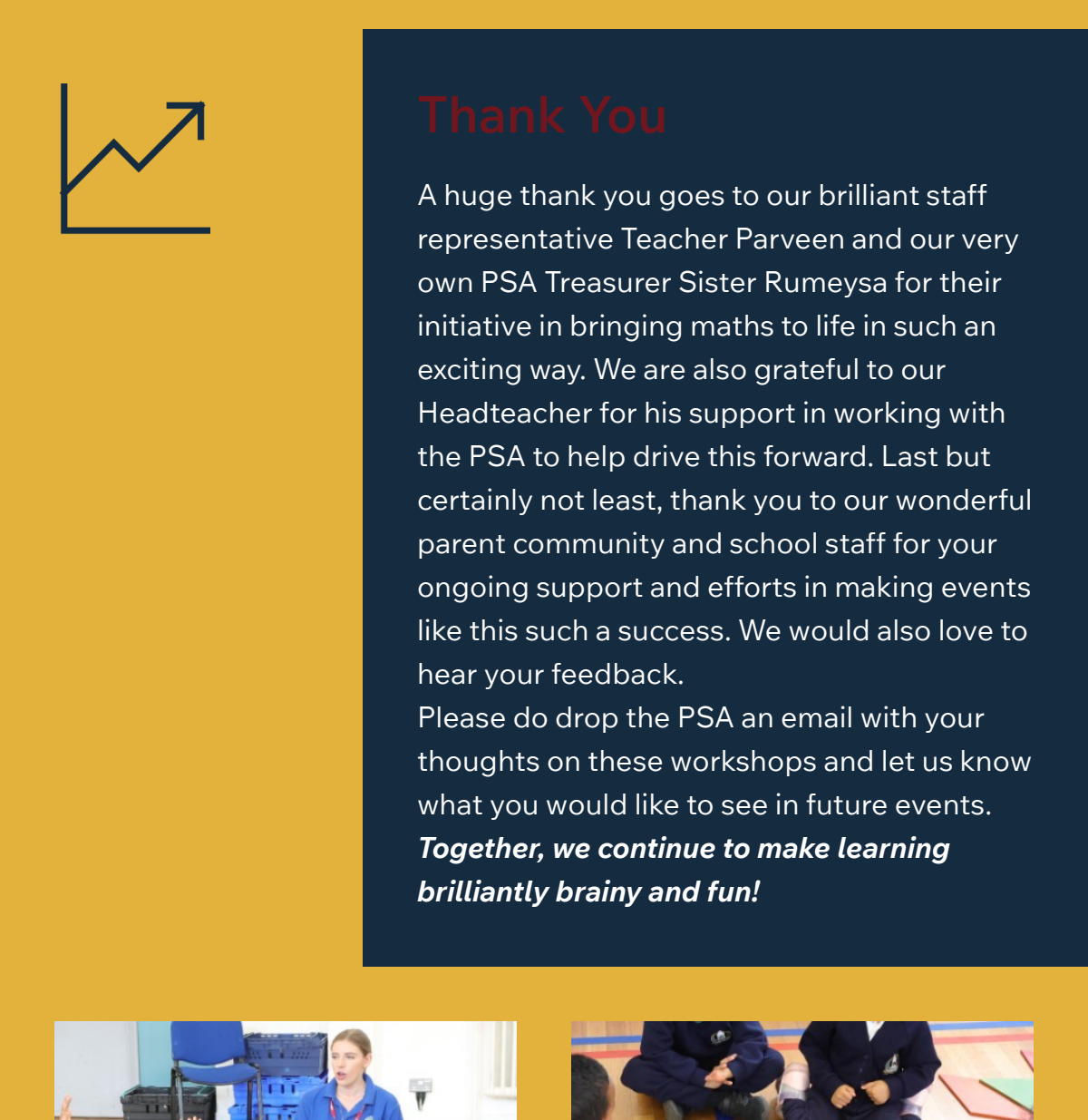

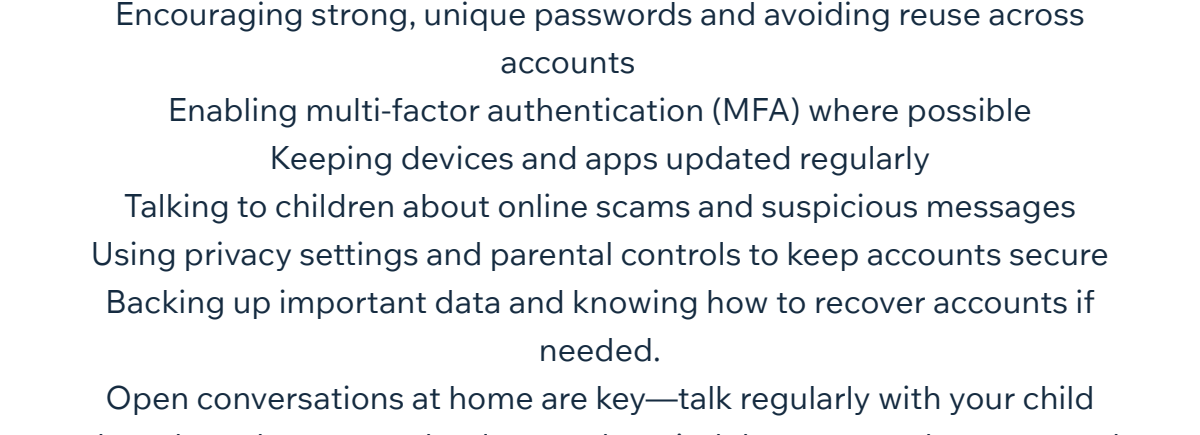

Together, we continue to make learning brilliantly, brainy and fun!



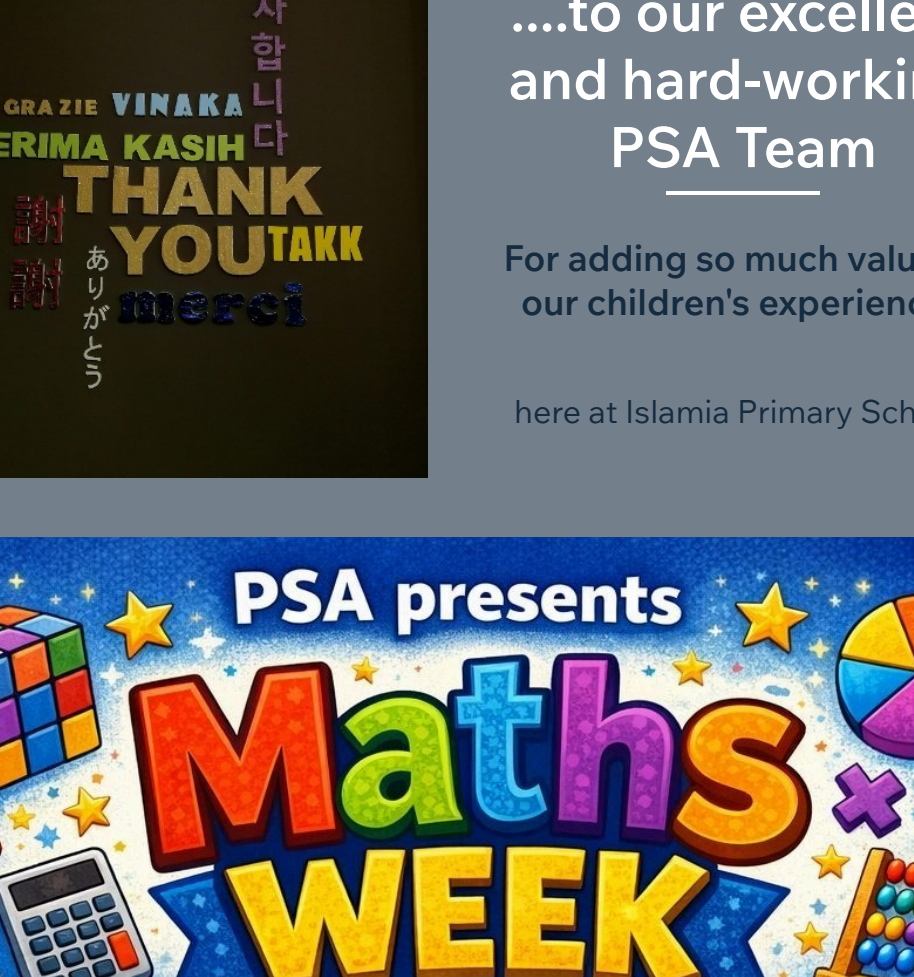
Arabic Letters in Reception..

Safeguarding Update: Top Tips for Cyber Resilience

As children increasingly use digital devices at home, it is important to help them stay safe online. Cyber resilience means having the knowledge and skills to protect devices, personal information and recover quickly from any online risks.

Parents can support this by:

- Encouraging strong, unique passwords and avoiding reuse across accounts
- Enabling multi-factor authentication (MFA) where possible
- Keeping devices and apps updated regularly
- Talking to children about online scams and suspicious messages
- Using privacy settings and parental controls to keep accounts secure
- Backing up important data and knowing how to recover accounts if needed.
- Open conversations at home are key—talk regularly with your child about how they use technology and remind them to speak to a trusted adult if something doesn't feel right online.

By taking simple steps, families can build confidence and help children enjoy technology safely and responsibly.
